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Get to Know Your Officers!

As you may know, the Province held our bi-annual officer elections last December, and as of January first, in addition to those individuals continuing on for another term, we have some new faces in familiar roles. Here's a little bit of info about each of our officers, both new and returning:

Seneschal: Mat Wyck has been Malagentia's Seneschal for the past three years, and is very much looking forward to his next two years in the role. He started in the SCA in 1990 in Endewearde, then strayed for a few decades before returning to the wonderful wackiness in 2016.

Wyck's primary interest in the SCA is rapier combat; he is a member of the Order of the Golden Rapier. He helped found the local chapter of the Foresters' Guild and was Malagentia's first Keeper of the Forest Court. He and co-conspirator Col. Woolfe also founded two newly popular Malagentia events – Otzi's Paradise and the Malagentia Test Kitchen. Wyck has recently started providing the narrative for scrolls, as well.

A member of House Fulton, Wyck enjoys building community for all and loves working with all folks, new and old, to help them find their SCA groove.

Chatelaine: My name is Collette d'Avignon (she/her), and I am your local New Member Coordinator! With that, my goal has been to help grow this office to be inclusive and welcoming to all, giving everyone who comes to Malagentia the same welcome I got not so long ago. Since starting, I've been practicing painting, garb construction,

The Cook's Guild of Malagentia met up in Litchfield on January 6th to celebrate winter feasts and the return of the sun. Originally this event was scheduled for mid - December, much closer to the Solstice, but life intervened and sent one of the hosts halfway

postponed until after the bulk of the winter holidays were over and folks could return from travel.

Lydia and Ulfrik hosted a garbed potluck and we had over 20 attendees show up, most of whom brought wonderful food to share! We had started a few fires outside, but most folks did not make it out back to cook over that hearth.

Cooks from all over Malagentia brought dishes like pease pottage, shortbread, fruit cake, sauerbraten, Roman burgers, and homemade goat cheese. We had lots of good conversations and departed with full bellies—and leftovers! It was everything we set out to be—a celebration that we do not do famine!

In the next several months, our Cook's Guild will be sharing recipes regularly and working to update the cooking section of the website. Our next official meeting is planned for a maple syrup/sugar session down in Gorham mid March, but there may be a pop up event before then. Watch for an announcement on our Discord and Facebook groups!

In the meantime, here is the recipe for one of the wonderful dishes that was shared: courtesy of the incomparable Camille des Jardins.

Camille's Split Pea with Ham Soup!

Ingredients:

- •Hambone with a generous quantity of meat
- •Dry Split peas, 2lb
- Celery
- Carrots
- Onion
- Parsley
- Summer Savory
- •Water, 1gal+1pt

Directions:

- In a large stockpot, cover hambone with water, approx. 3qt to 1gal. Bring to a low boil and immediately turn heat down to simmer for 4-6 hours (I leave it bubbling away overnight). Cover pot. Watch evaporation, there will be some but not a significant amount as long as the heat is low enough to maintain simmer but not boil.
- After stock has simmered enough (it will be a lovely rose-gold color, hopefully), remove from heat. Remove bones (the meat should fall right off). Skim the floating fat bits and remove any overly fatty or unpalatable chunks of meat as desired. Use a potato masher or fork to further shred the meat if necessary. Return to medium heat.
- Rinse and clean 1-2lb of dry split peas (1lb per approx. 1/2 gal water seems to make soup rather than spackle), add to pot. Stir regularly.
- Cut up onion, carrots, celery, any other veggies (fennel bulb sometimes is tasty) into small chunks and add to the pot. Measure them with your heart (I used 2 small onions, 6 medium/large carrots and 1 1/2 hearts of celery for ~1 gal water and 2lbs peas).
- Add summer savory and parsley (about 2-3tbsp for quantity in this recipe)
- Add remainder of gallon of water plus up to 2 cups for desired consistency/pot capacity.
- Cook until peas have lost any resemblance to split peas and your pot is filled with green bubbling goo. -Soup will thicken as it sits. Add water as desired to thin per serving. Freezes well (thank goodness).


