

Cooks' Guild Potluck

Have you been to been to one of the Cooks' Guild meetups, yet? If not, please consider this your open and ongoing invitation to join us as we gather to swap recipes, research and most importantly—food.

This past December, the Guild gathered at a private residence in Litchfield, Maine for an optionally

garbed potluck. This time, the focus was on food either familiar to your persona, or switch it around and come garbed in the period based on what you cooked. Offerings included Irish soda bread, cremoneze green tart, beef and barley stew, homemade pasta with carrot sauce, a saffron pastry Coffyn of Three Beasts, smoked fish and pickled vegetables, lamb stew, springerle cookies, pomegranate salad and so, so much more.

sweets exchange and a Gothic focused "death dinner." You don't need to be a Guild member to join in. You don't even need to know how to cook (though a willingness to wash a dish or two never hurts)! The Cooks' Guild welcomes anyone with an interest in period cooking and needs eaters just as much as cooks. Seriously. We all only know how to cook for a dozen or more each, so you can imagine what it looks like when you put a group of us together. In the meantime, we'll leave you with one of the recipes that appeared at the potluck.

Cremoneze Green Tart

Adapted from a 16th century French recipe, this is a variation on a spinach tart, lightened by a good amount of fresh mint with dried red currents added for a bit of sweetness.

To make a cremoneze green tart, take spinach & put it to boil & chop it fine, & a handful of chopped mint, with 2 ounces of grated parmesan, four ounces of melted butter, three ounces of sugar, two ounces of currants, two raw eggs, a quarter ounce of cinnamon, two nutmegs, & make the tart like the others, & sugar thereon & serve it so.

Ingredients:

- 1/2 pound spinach, washed and chopped*
- 1/2 cup of mint, finely chopped
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 4 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 1 Tbsp. sugar
- 2 Tbsp. dried currents
- 1/4 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/8 tsp. nutmeg
- 1 pie crust, unbaked**

Method:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Combine ingredients in a bowl and mix well until everything is coated thoroughly with egg. Pour*** into an unbaked pie shell and bake for approximately 45 minutes, until a knife or skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.

Let cool completely, then serve cold or at room temperature.

*the original recipe says to boil the spinach, but I've found it's better to put it in uncooked. It'll soften down nicely while baking.

**can be made using gluten free crusts, consider reducing the sugar if using one that's already sweetened.

***more like spread—it's a very thick mixture, don't be alarmed.

Words from the Green

As winter sets in, the woods and wetlands of Malagentia are growing quiet in some ways. Many birds have returned to the south. I'm no longer seeing osprey or turkey vultures, the morning bird song is much reduced, and the cricket sounds of evening feel like a distant memory. The chipmunks are tucked in with their caches, and the other small tunneling mammals must be eagerly awaiting a good snow so they can resume more protected forays.

It's easy for me to get consumed by indoor projects this time of year. Processing materials I foraged in the autumn, or finishing up medicinal preparations started in summer when everything was ripe and full. There are acorns to shell and grind into flour, oils and tinctures to strain and bottle, or turn into salves and creams, and bark and plant fiber to clean and prepare for making baskets, cords, and string. All that potential of summer and autumn seems to be asking to be sorted and put away, to be made ready and available for future inspiration.

I know many crave the sun's return, and the longer hours of daylight. I truly love the dark seasons. This year, I've been savoring the quiet, early dusk and long dark evenings. Either tucking into my own nest early, or enjoying the opportunity to work on a passion project late into the night. Is it 7:30, or is it 12:45? Who knows!

If I remember to bundle up and get myself

outside there's actually so much going on. The loons and diving ducks are back and chatty in the mouth of the river near my home. Each new snow is a super fun opportunity to follow animal tracks and be curious about who's out there and what they are up to. Right now I'm wondering if we'll get enough deep cold before the next snows to have a chance to ice skate on wild water this year.

And fortunately, one of my favorite foraged treats is still available this time of year. Here's a recipe for soda made from white pine needles. I usually wait for ice or wind storms to knock down branches, but if these beautiful trees are abundant where you live, maybe you can beg a branch from them to make it anytime.

Eastern White Pine Needle Soda:

Put 1 cup fresh pine needles into a sterilized 16 ounce Grolsch style bottle. Include the whole tassels with a bit of the stem to help with fermentation. Add 2 tablespoons sugar or raw honey to the bottle and cover with 1 ½ cup filtered water, leaving 1 to 2 inches of headspace at the top. Close the lid and shake the bottle to distribute the honey.

Place the bottle in a warm place to ferment. A kitchen counter usually works well. The soda should start fermenting and producing carbonation after 2 - 3 days. Be careful opening the bottle, and if you leave them to ferment longer than 3 days, burp the bottles to release the pressure. Strain and serve over ice with a slice of lemon, lime, or orange if you like. Pine soda tastes a lot like Sprite. Any edible conifer needles (pine, fir, spruce) can be used for making this soda.

Finally, to complete the Order, **Gavin Kent** was summoned and added to their ranks, with scroll by Camille des Jardins.

Shortly after, Rwuan Osbern did

appear before Their Majesties, who recounted tales of his exploits on the rapier field and bade him join Their **Order of the Silver Rapier**, with scroll done

by Fionna the Volatile, with words by Bo of Malagentia.

inducting her into the **Order of the Silver Brooch** for her work in turning leather and metals into art.

As Their reign came to its natural end, Their Majesties had two final acts that They would see done in Their Last Court. First was **Rory of**



Malagentia called before Them and for fulfilling the tenants of valor, courtesy and honour on the youth martial field, was named among the ranks of the Order of Gawain and presented with a box made

by Christine Violette. In further celebration of the Society's youth, the presence of **Penelope of Malagentia** was requested, who was, for exemplifying service and the qualities so desired by the Kingdom, awarded the **Tyger's Eye** and given a token in commemoration.

Later that same day, having ascended to their place upon the Tyger Thrones, Their Majesties King Matthew des Arden and Oueen Fiamuin Kareman called forth **Colette de Herrison**, and for her service to the Crown in myriad ways, including needle and thread, did first award her a token of the **Rabbit in** the Moon and immediately after name her Seamstress to the Crown. Similarly was Thallos of Brighton Manor called forth before the Court and honoured likewise as **Seamstress to the Crown**. Having further business with members of the Province, the presence of Fayette des Rothenburg was requested, and for her many and varied accomplishments in the field of arts, she was then inducted into the **Order of the Silver Brooch**. commemorated in a scroll done by Embla Knutrdottir, with words by Bo of Malagentia.

Next was another group commanded to appear before Their Majesties, for Malagentia is known not just for service and prowess and art, but also the manner and comportment with which those things are accomplished. Thusly, Her Majesty Fiamuin did see before Her Richard Crowe, Andromeda Sophronios and Tiernan Shepherd, and for their long-time embodiment of the fine

qualities recognised by the East, presented all three with the token inducting them into the **Consort's Order of Courtesy**. Finally, as the day drew to a close, Their Majesties decided Their business could not be completed without one further act of recognition. His Majesty Matthew summoned into His presence **Edward Mac Guyver dos Scorpus** and did present him with His **Sovereign's Award of Esteem**.

In the Shire of Mountain Freehold, Their Majesties held a great tournament by which to choose Their Heirs for the coming year. But in addition to such martial business, They also held a Court at which they called forth **Aloysius Sartor**, and before all did present him with a **Writ** to attend and sit in contemplation of whether he would join the **Order of the Pelican**, a question to be answered at A Market Day at Birka in the Barony of Stonemarche this coming January.

Finally, in the far Southern Shire of Rusted Woodlands, Their Majesties bade **Aesa Ormstunga** present themselves at the 100 Minutes War, where they were commanded by **Writ** to attend Them at Mudthaw in the Barony of Settmour Swamp and give answer whether they would join the **Order of Defense**.

charge of this newsletter, this is what you get)








